What is CAP?

The College Accelerated Program is your convenient route to a college degree.

How does it work?

Thomas Edison State College has agreed to accept CFT college credit recommendations (courses evaluated and approved by the American Council on Education) in order that CFT students may achieve degree status easily while they are pursuing their CFT certificate and diploma.

Where is Thomas Edison State College and what type of an institution are they?

Thomas Edison State College, founded in 1972, is located in Trenton, N.J.
